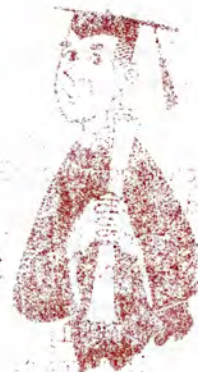

ATTENTION NEBRASKA CHRISTIAN COLLEGE ALUMNUS!

The Executive Committee of Nebraska Christian College directed me to investigate a possibility that may result in the construction of a badly needed college dormitory.

A recent consultation with a banking institution revealed we could have this building without a major fund drive. Here are the particulars:

Bank would loan -----	\$96,000.00
Cash -----	\$16,000.00
Escrow Funds -----	<u>\$48,000.00</u>

ESTIMATED TOTAL COST ----- \$160,000.00

The escrow funds (30% of the total cost) must be obtained from individuals who will place cash funds on deposit in the lending institution. It is for these funds that we are making our plea.

The depositor's funds would not be jeopardized since the dormitory rentals would make the annual payments with ease. The depositor would receive regular dividends at the current interest rate. The only inconvenience - the escrow funds will serve as collateral and cannot be withdrawn until the indebtedness on the building has been reduced by the 30% which would occur within 5-7 years.

Perhaps you are fortunate enough to have monies invested in savings that you would allow to work for the Lord while working for you. If so, fill out the blank below and return to Lloyd Sapp, 910 Park Avenue, Norfolk, Nebraska.

I HEREBY ACKNOWLEDGE that I am in complete sympathy with the fine work Nebraska Christian College is doing in educating a Christian leadership of the world of tomorrow. With every influence I command, I desire to aid the progress, influence and testimony of Nebraska Christian College.

To give evidence of this faith, I hereby declare my intentions to ascribe the sum of _____ dollars () for the purpose of providing collateral for the erection of a badly needed college dormitory.

It is understood that the money will be deposited with a government bonded banking association and that I will receive the regular dividend receipts agreeable to the banking institution and myself. I further understand that the principal herein named shall be released within a period of less than seven years without further encumbrances.

I set my signature to this document only as a statement of intention. In no way can it be construed to be binding upon me or my estate. The final decision for assignment will be made after full details are presented and acceptable by me or my heirs.

We are happy to introduce Mr. Louis L. Akin, "Mr. NCC, 1967," Mr. Akin, who turned 76 this past November, has long been an active promoter and supporter of Nebraska Christian College. He is especially remembered for his scholarship contributions for worthy students.

The history of Mr. Akin is a long and productive one for Christ. He states that he grew up as "a typical Iowa plow boy and was raised in a saddle." He entered Iowa State University with the intentions of a law career but soon turned to the ministry. Upon becoming a Christian minister in 1912, he has served pastorates at Stuart, Audubon, Exira and Logan, Iowa and San Dimas, California. He has also taken an active part in governmental affairs, serving two sessions in the Iowa State Legislature, was on the Carroll school board, and many other minor offices. He was also appointed by President Franklin Roosevelt to assist the farmers of the community in refinancing their farms during the great depression.

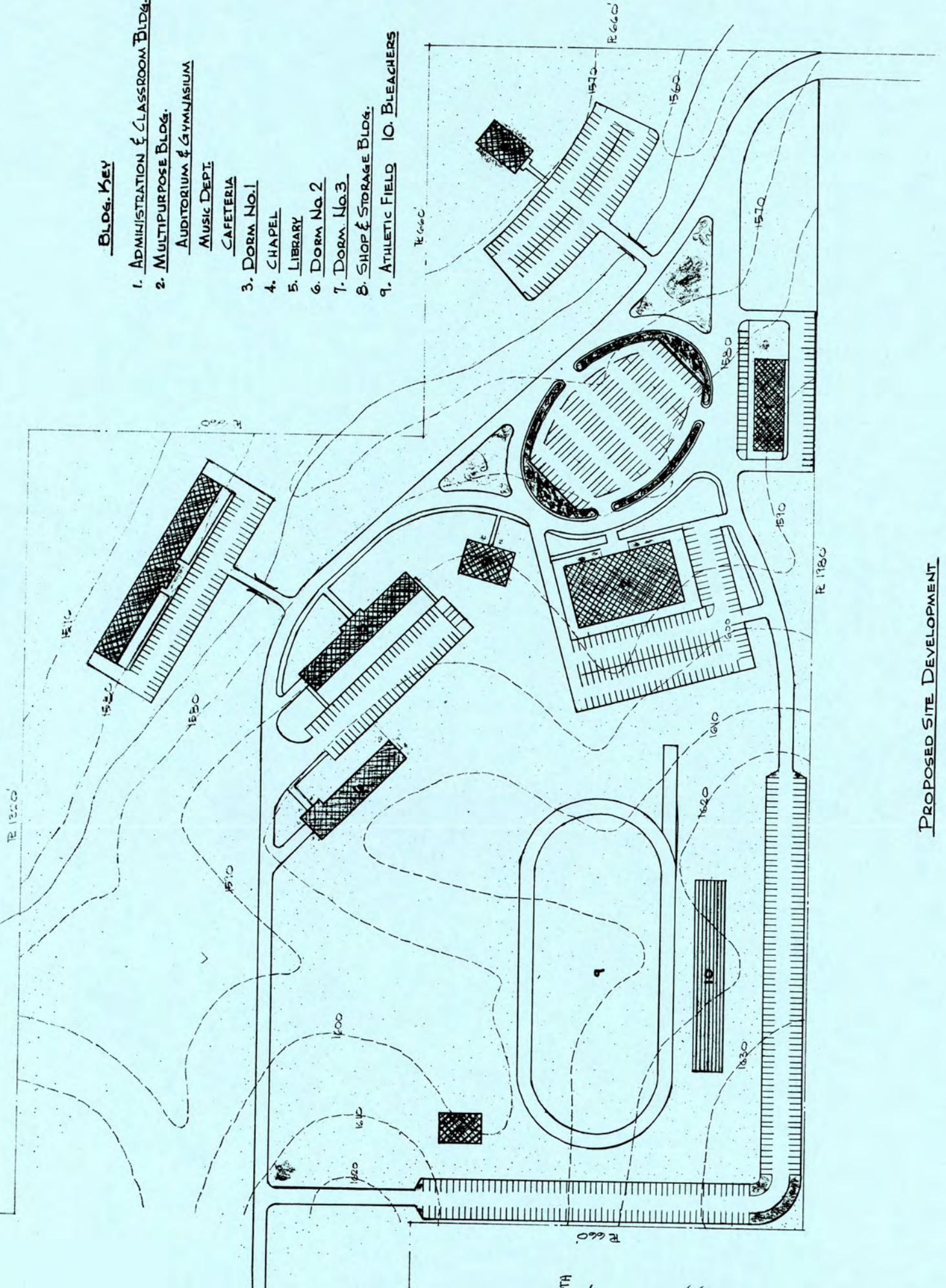

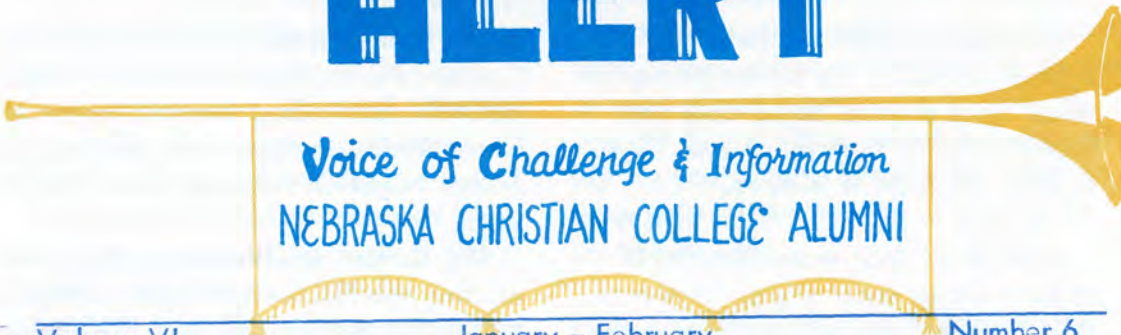
