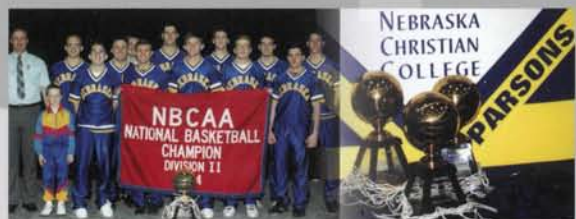

The school continued to grow and more space was needed for the school to expand, prompting NCC to purchase 80 acres on Syracuse Avenue in northwest Norfolk. Here a new campus was developed featuring dorms, administration building, cafeteria, library, music wing and a gymnasium. For the next 36 years, NCC faithfully served Christ and His Church from this location. During this time thousands of students from 40 states and 15 countries received a quality Christian education and went on to impact churches and communities around the world.
