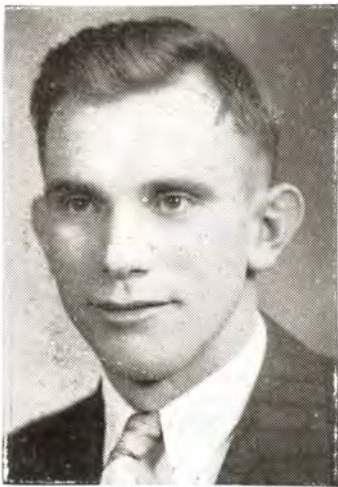

EVELYN SNOW. Evelyn is our only post graduate and is taking two classes the second semester. She has an A. B. from Manhattan Bible College.

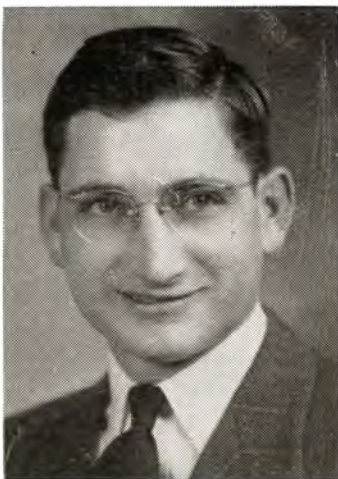

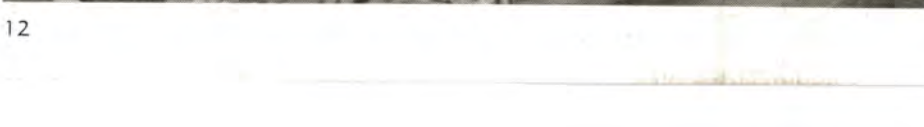

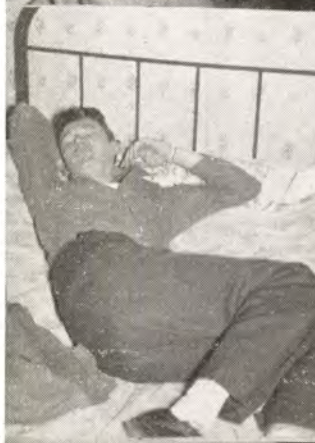
