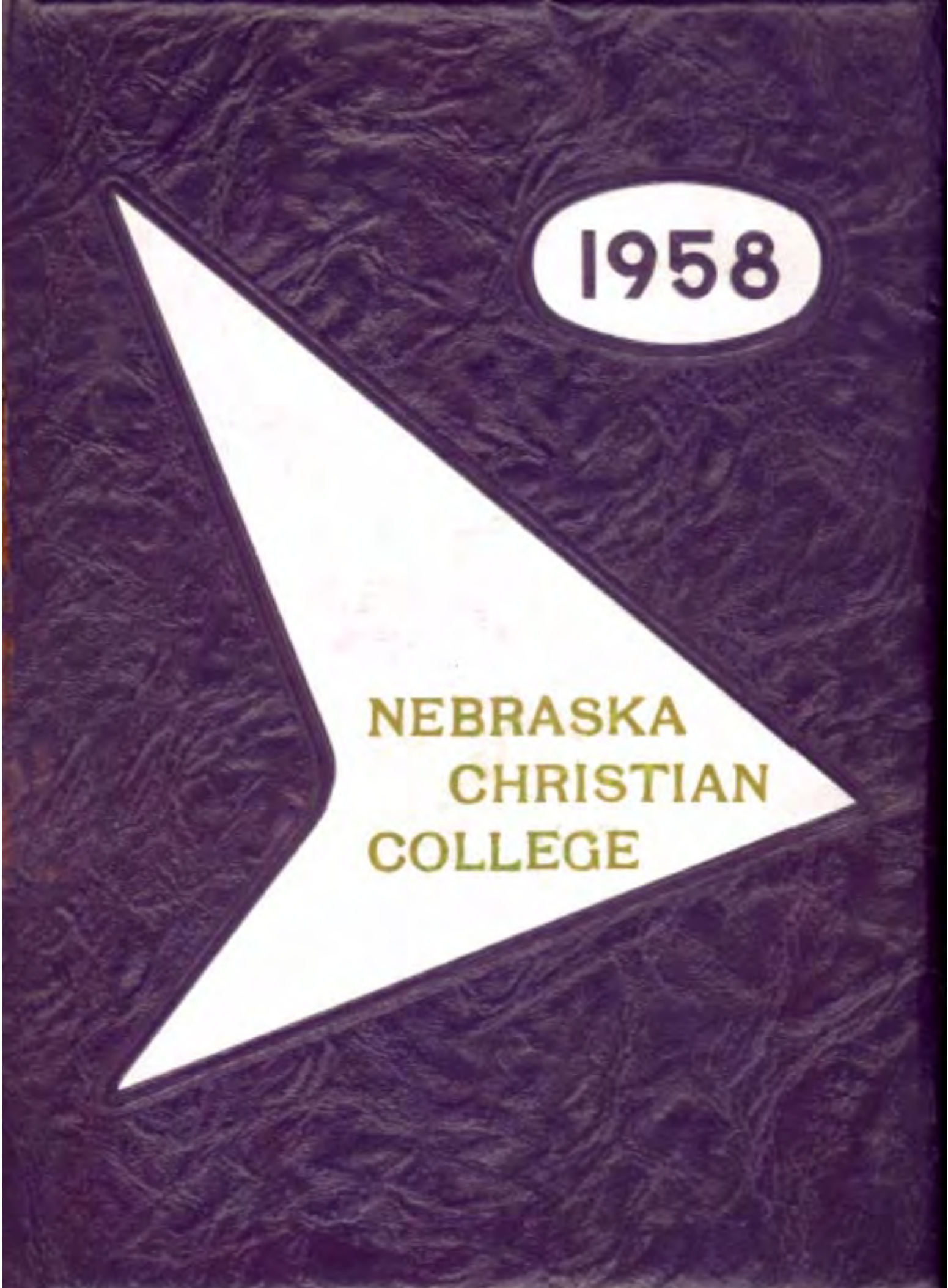

# Dedication

He is despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief: and we hid as it were our faces from him; he was despised, and we esteemed him not.*

But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed. —Isaiah 53:2-6

"A backward look into the past of NCC will surely cause one to acknowledge that Jesus has directed and sustained the work. With only twenty-five dollars and a few men of faith, He called the college into existence. With an increasing group of friends He has sustained her through these thirteen years.

"In 1945 just before school began the present administration building was purchased. Shortly after school was opened the trustees bought the girls' dormitory. Two years following the opening of school the first students were graduated. Each succeeding year saw additional graduates excepting the year 1953-1954.

"In the late summer of 1953 the boys' dormitory was purchased as a combination faculty residence and student quarters. In the spring of 1955, the trustees purchased the lots to serve as a building site for our proposed new administration building. The fund was raised by the students and faculty.

"This spring we have successfully completed a Development Fund campaign to raise \$158,000 for the new administration building. Building plans are being carried out and construction will soon begin.

"The future is bright for NCC and the cause of ministerial training. Surely the Lord is leading all the way!"

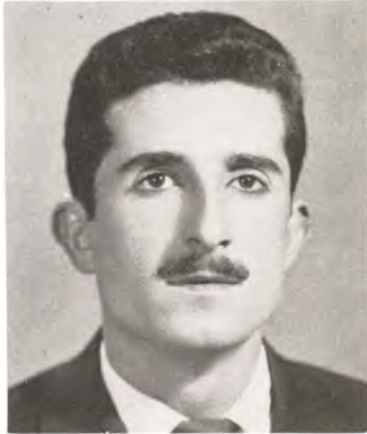

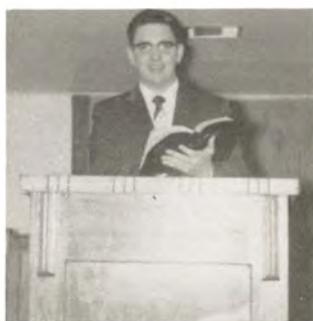

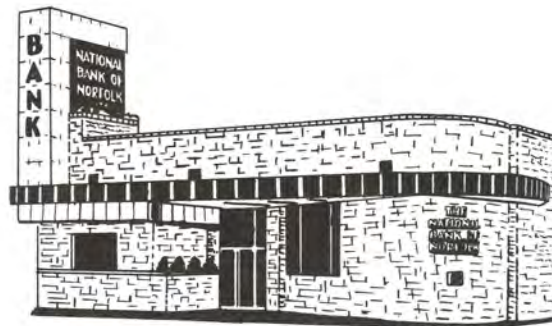
