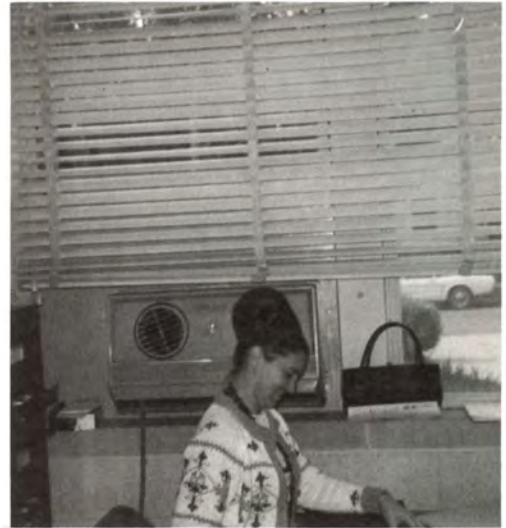
The development office secretary is Miss Margaret Young. She comes from Lincoln, Nebraska, and joined the staff as a fulltime worker in 1967.

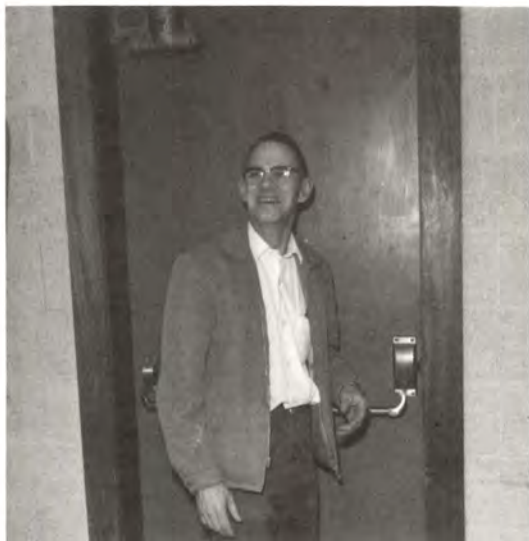




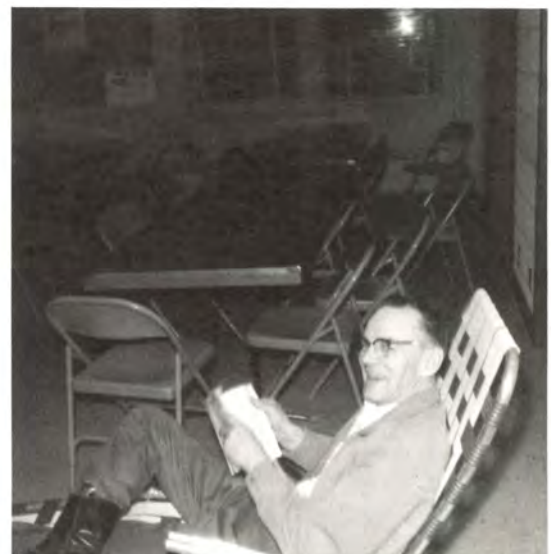
Lee Utterback works at his duties as custodian. Being dorm dad and going to school as well keep him busy. Keep right at it there, young man!

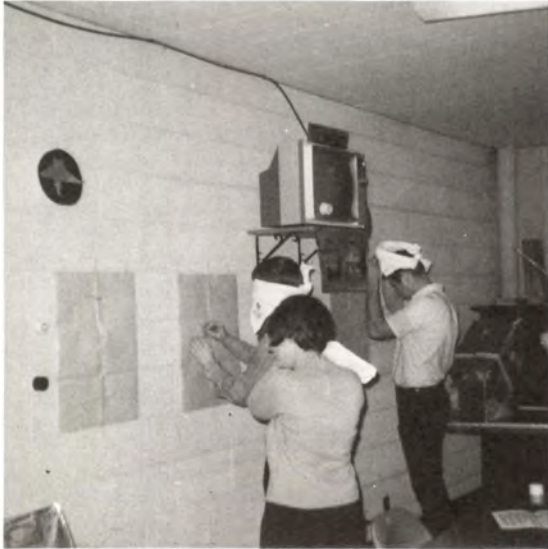

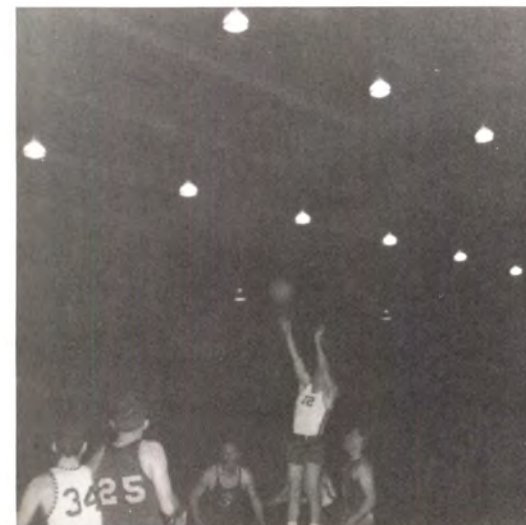
